



Program Background & Facts

To decrease juvenile incarceration and maintain public safety, Redeploy Illinois develops community programs that offer judges and prosecutors an alternative tool to interrupt cycles of crime through youth rehabilitation services.

Sponsored by the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS), the Redeploy program has made communities safer, put youth on a positive path to adulthood, and saved Illinois money. Between 2005 and 2020, it diverted 4,000 youth from the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice (IDJJ), saving the state more than \$220 million in unnecessary incarceration costs.

2020 REDEPLOY OUTCOMES:

41 counties participated in the Redeploy Program

61% of youth experienced an increase in protective factors

11 months was the average length of stay in the program

83% of youth had no new arrests while in the program

421 youth were referred & served

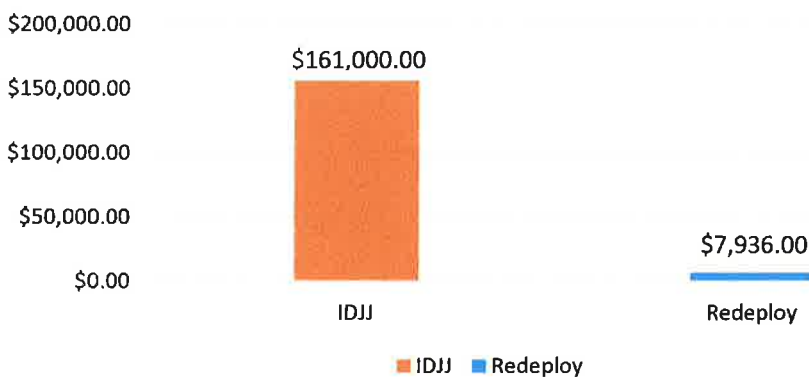
78% decrease of eligible commitments across Redeploy sites

71% of youth experienced a decrease in risk factors

Redeploy Illinois provides evidence-based services to high-risk youth, including case management, counseling, court advocacy & crisis intervention, which offer:

1. A cost effective & lasting alternative to youth incarceration
2. Locally developed solutions to sustainably address delinquent behavior, keep families together & retain youth in schools
3. The establishment of a collaborative infrastructure between courts, states' attorneys, law enforcement, schools, community-based agencies & others
